- I suffer from Terminal laziness.
- I have Attention Deficit Disorder.
- My inner child was bugging me for ice cream.
- My shoes are too expensive to walk in.
- Wheelchair symbol? I thought it was a rocking chair.
- My religion forbids acts of common courtesy.
- I am disabled by a painfully swollen ego.
- I have as much right to park here as a disabled person.
- No matter the reason, will be back shortly.

Your vehicle has been photographed by my cell phone and it will be emailed to the local Law Enforcement Agency with a date & time stamp on the picture in hopes they will contact you.

- 1. First offense: \$250-\$500**
- 2. Second offense: \$300-\$600**

If a person violates the law regarding parking in accessible spaces, the local law enforcement agencies have the authority to issue tickets.

Additionally, some communities have volunteers who enforce parking laws.
